
History and archaeology events in Bucks AUGUST 2022

A history walk around once-royal Brill

Mike Farley is the author of The Kings at Brill, a newly published book on the days when the medieval kings came regularly to there hilltop manor at Brill and to hunt in the forest of Bernwood. He will lead this walk around the historic sites and buildings of Brill, and set out clues to the location of the royal manor, with its a pre-Norman hall, chapel, gatehouse and bridge over a ditch or moat.



- Saturday 20 August: Meet at Brill Windmill at 2.30pm.
 The walk will take between 90 minutes and two hours, starting at Brill Windmill and finishing near The Green and All Saints Church. There will be some steepish climbs and stout footwear required.
- We hope to arrange tea and cake after the walk.
- **Use your own transport:** Brill is 14 miles west of Aylesbury; the easiest approach is from the A41 Aylesbury-Bicester road, turning south at Kingswood and following signs for Brill. If your car has SatNav the postcode for Brill Windmill is HP18 9TQ and it is in South Hills, Brill.

First chance to see the Roman busts discovered in the archaeological dig at Stoke Mandeville

Two rare Roman heads from busts uncovered during the excavation of Stoke Mandeville old church have been loaned to



the museum in Aylesbury. They will be available to public view until the end of October. The sculptures were found in a circular ditch around the foundations of what is thought to have been a Roman mausoleum, discovered beneath the nave of the old church during excavations ahead of the HS2 rail line.

• Entry to the museum is £5.50 for adults, with children free.
